Alice: Hello, Martha, and welcome to Magnificat House!

Martha: Why Thank you, I am glad to be here.

A: You came quite a distance to get here. Where did you grow up?

M: I grew up all over the West Coast. I was born in California but spent most of my young childhood in Nevada. Later my family moved to Washington and Arizona. I attended high school in Arizona. I've lived in Twisp, Washington since 2006.

#### A: How did you first hear about Magnificat House?

M: I was at Echo Camp 2012 in Covington, Louisiana. I was having a conversation with Fr. Steve Bruno. I mentioned that I was wanting to discern my vocation alongside other young women and he told me to check Magnificat House out. I still have the business card he wrote Sr. Sylvia Thibodeaux's contact information on for me.

#### A: How did God continue to call you to here after that?

M: I've been discerning for about 2 years. Throughout that period I've had family dilemmas and emergencies that I feel have interrupted my discernment. When I heard about Magnificat House from Fr. Steve at Echo Camp I was very excited about the possibility of coming.

Soon after that, my brother-in-law passed away. I redirected my focus to helping my sister and her family. Throughout this time I continued to pray about my discernment and continued to feel as if God was calling me here. Eventually Continued on page 2

M: Loving it so far. It has been an adjustment culturally and weather-wise – I'm used to about 3-feet of snow this time of year. I love having a Chapel right downstairs and doing prayer with the community has just been really good for me. I'm definitely feeling the internal struggle that comes with discernment right now and being here – in a space where I feel comfortable and feel the love of God so clearly – is a tremendous help.

# Discerner Reflection by Martha Knox

"In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. [. . .] And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, full of grace and truth . . ." In 1:1, 14

## Magnificat Mentors: Hitting the Road, Spreading the Word

During the months of January, February and March Sr. Diane Roche (RSCJ) and Sr. Carmen Bertrand (SSF) have been out visiting parishes and campus ministries throughout the New Orleans Area in order to get the word out about the programs being offered at Magnificat House.
